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














Plan and Budget 2025-2030

- ➤ On June 10, the 5-Year Plan was approved by the Alameda County Board of Supervisors after an extensive participatory planning process with the Community Advisory Council
- ► The **Measure C 5-Year Plan includes over \$1B** for early care and education
- First 5 has rapidly entered a major implementation phase
- ► We want to learn from national leaders doing groundbreaking ECE systems change work across the country to inform Alameda County's model


